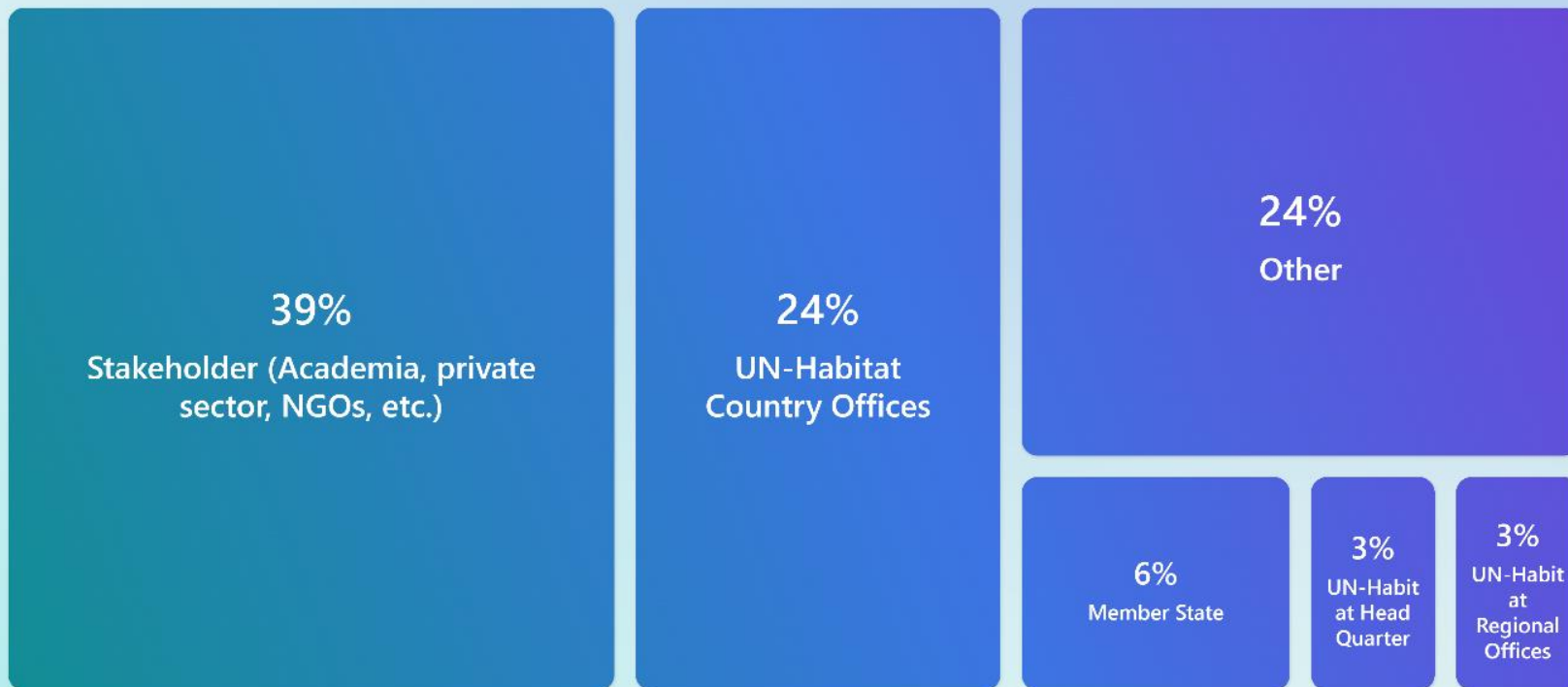

Intervention Mechanisms



NUA 15: READDRESS - RECOGNIZE - ADOPT

a) Readdress the way we **plan, finance, develop, govern and manage cities** and human settlements, recognizing sustainable urban and territorial development as essential to the achievement of sustainable development and prosperity for all.

(b) Recognize the **leading role of national Governments**, as appropriate, in the definition and implementation of inclusive and effective urban policies and legislation for sustainable urban development, and the equally **important contributions of subnational and local governments**, as well as civil society and other relevant stakeholders, in a transparent and accountable manner;

(c) Adopt sustainable, people-centred, age- and gender-responsive and **integrated approaches** to urban and territorial development by implementing policies, strategies, capacity development and actions at all levels, based on fundamental drivers of change.

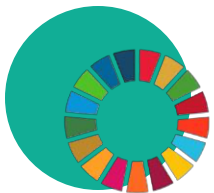

Despite progress

Weak multilevel governance, unclear roles among government levels, poor coordination, and limited involvement of local governments in national decision-making



Multilevel governance

Stronger in highly decentralised countries, fiscal cooperation and established dialogue between national and local governments.



Decentralization trend

Planning, policy making, and finance at national level still centralized

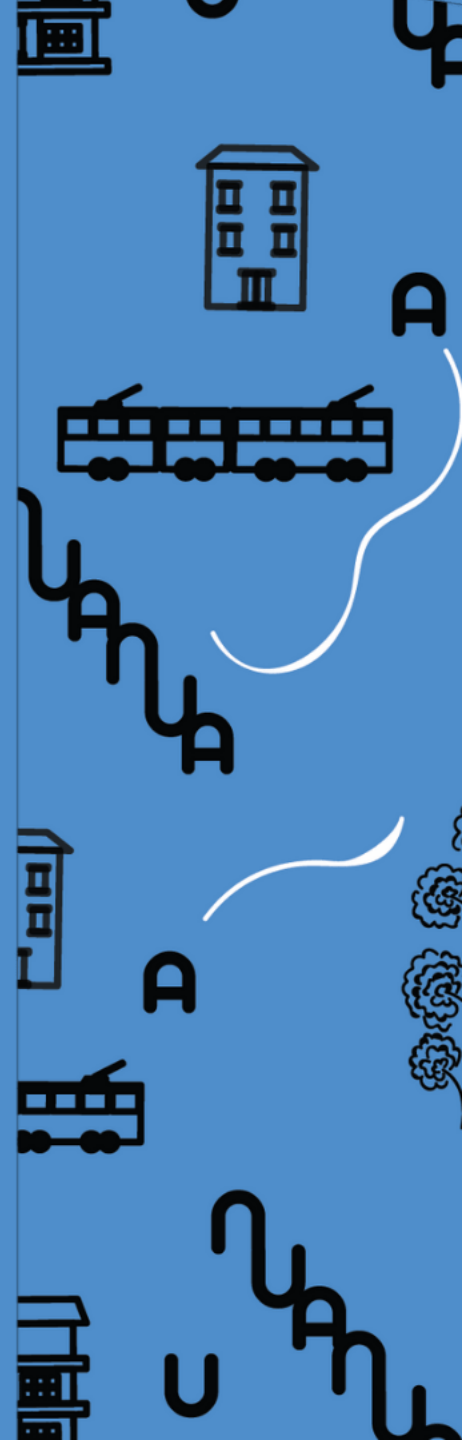

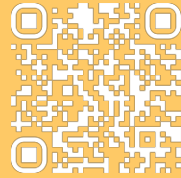

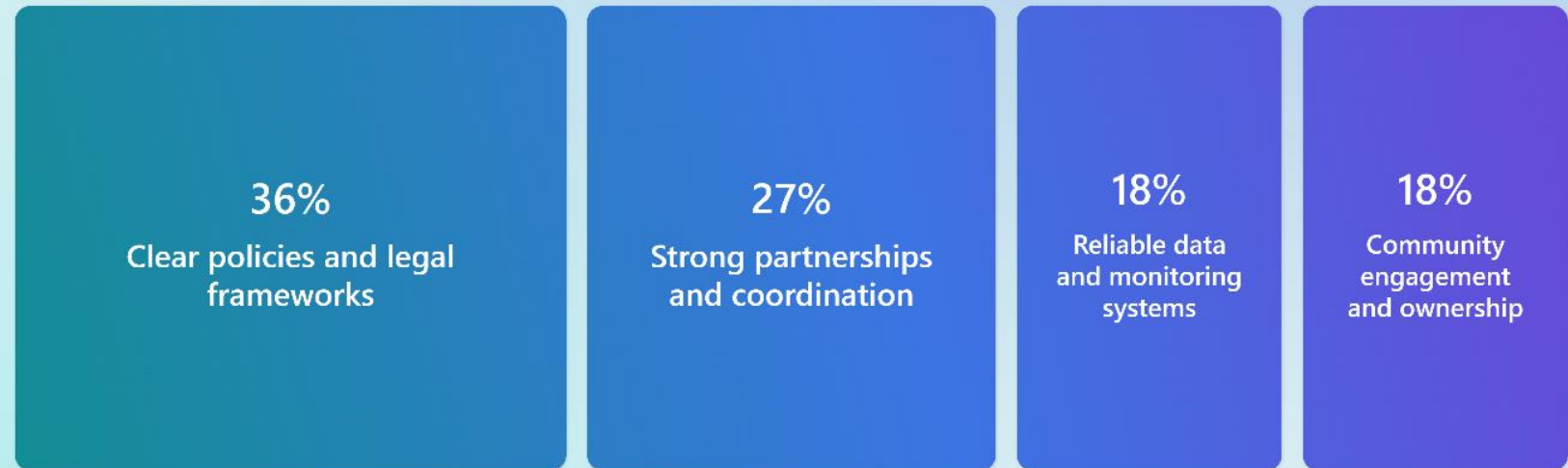
When moving from commitments to National and Local Urban Plans, what do you see as the biggest enabler?

Overview of National Urban Policy



Overview of NUPs



National/Regional Urban Policy:

Coherent set of decisions derived through a deliberate government-led process of coordinating and rallying various actors for a common vision and goal that will promote more transformative, productive, inclusive and resilient urban development for the long term.

National urban policy supports positive economic, social and environmental **links between urban, peri-urban and rural areas** by strengthening national and regional development planning



SDGs and NUA both recognize the importance of National Urban Policies (NUPs) as a key tool for achieving sustainable development.

SDGs – primarily through Target 11.a.1

NUA – explicitly mentioned in 9 paragraphs. NUPs also one of the 5 NUA implementation pillars

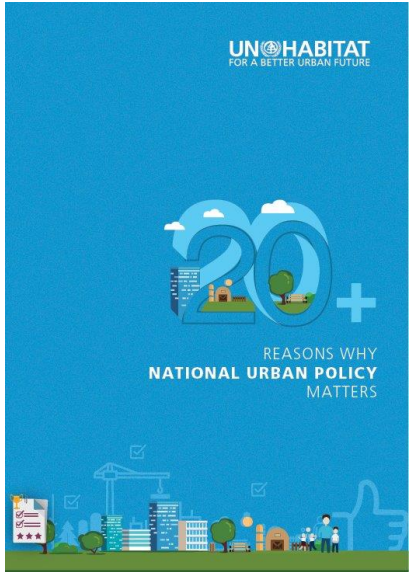
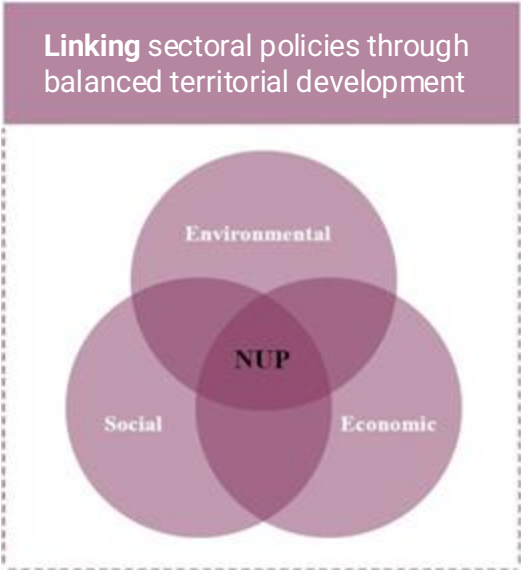
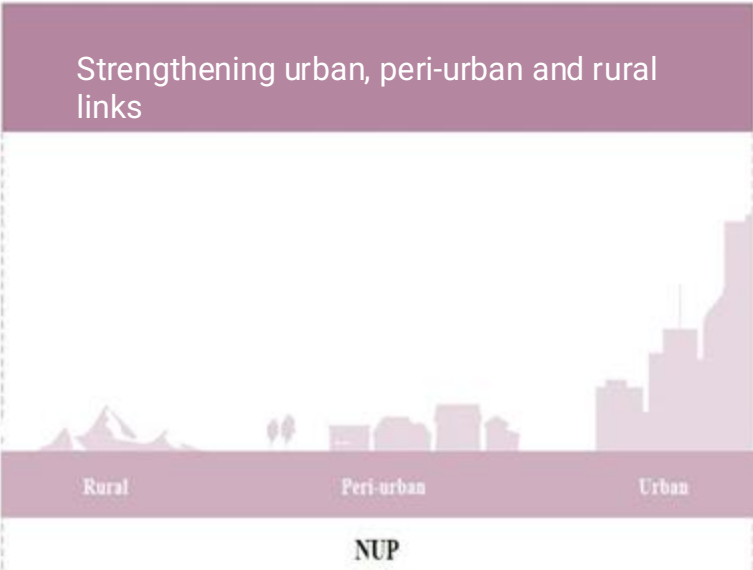
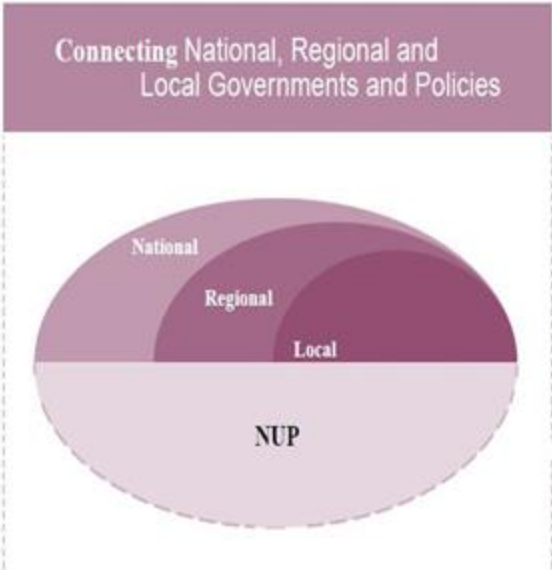
Rationale for NUPs

National Urban Policies can be:

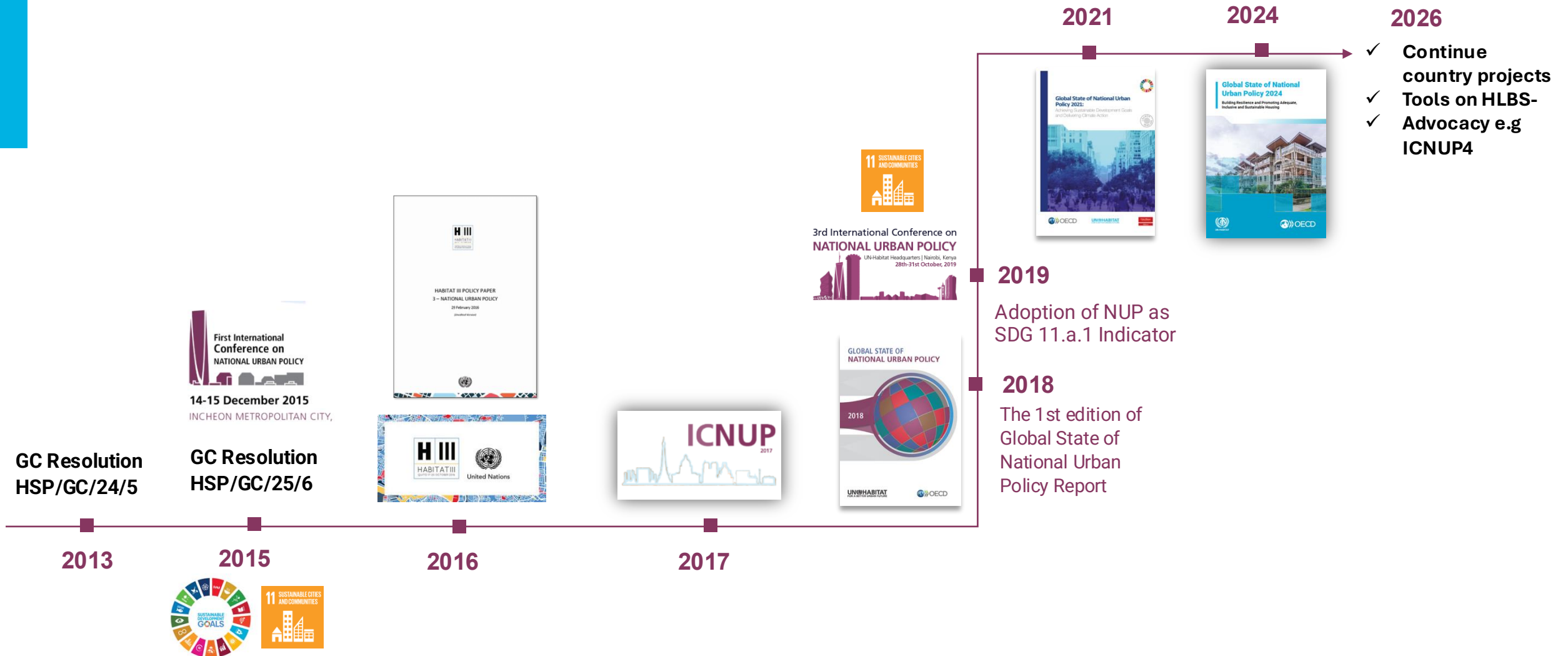
A framework
that provides an overarching coordination to address urban challenges, maximize the benefits of urbanization, while mitigating potential adverse externalities.

A lever
to amalgamate the dispersed energy and potential of urban centres within a national system of cities and towns.

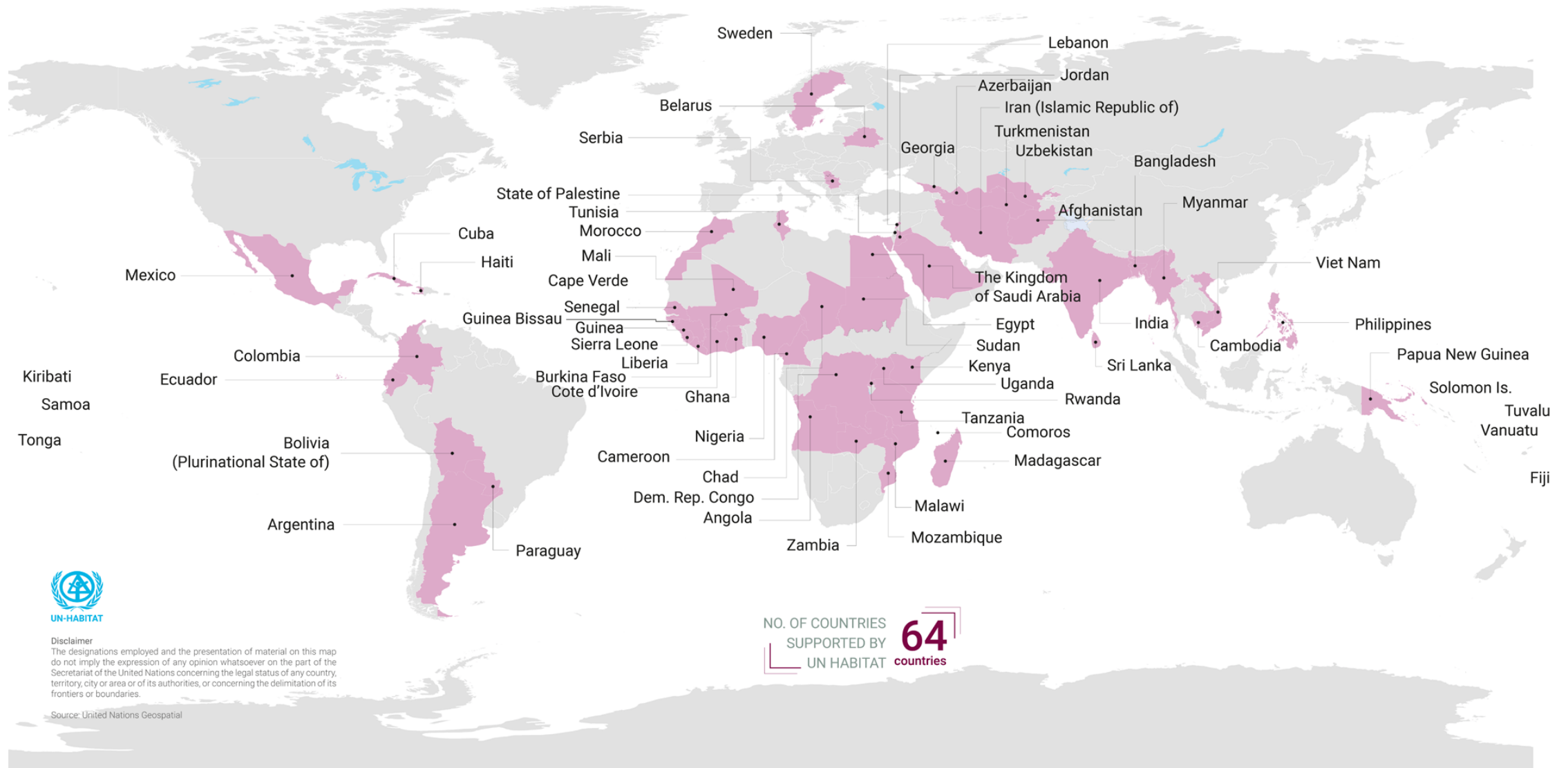
A tool
to coordinate the work of different sectors and tiers of government, consult other urban actors, establish the incentives for more sustainable practices, and allocate resources.

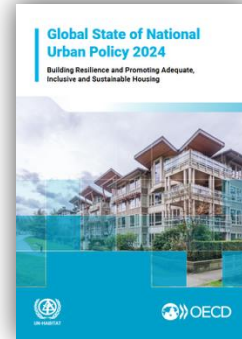
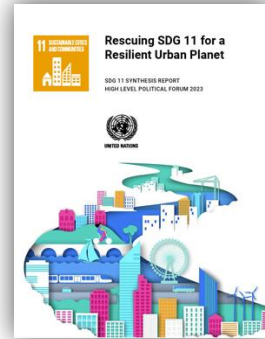

Alignment with SDGs and NUA



Monitoring SDG 11

2019- NUP adopted as an **indicator for SDG 11.a.1** by the UN Statistical Commission

Ongoing- NUPP partners collect data for **SDG Target 11.a** measured through **SDG indicator 11.a.1** : Number of countries that have a National Urban Policy or Regional Development Plans that:

- (a) *respond to population dynamics,*
- (b) *ensure balanced territorial development, and*
- (c) *increase local fiscal space*

- NUP explicitly mentioned in Paragraphs **15a; 81; 86** and **89**
- NUA Pillars of Implementation:
 - a) *national urban policies,*
 - b) *urban legislation and regulations*
 - c) urban planning and design,
 - d) local economy and municipal finance, and local implementation.

Urban legislation is one of the **five pillars** of NUA implementation.

- Establishing **clear, transparent, and enforceable legal frameworks**
- Promoting inclusive laws
- Participatory governance
- Transparency and accountability



URLS are a **core component** of NUA

NUA promotes **integrated territorial development.**

URL highlighted in paragraph 26, 49, 82 and 93 of NUA



Metropolitan management is a **practical implementation pathway** for the New Urban Agenda.

The NUA recognizes that urbanization extends beyond city boundaries into **suburban, peri-urban, and rural zones.**

Operationalizes the NUA's principles by:

- Bridging urban-rural divides.
- Promoting inclusive governance.
- Supporting integrated planning and finance.
- Enhancing resilience and sustainability at the metropolitan scale.

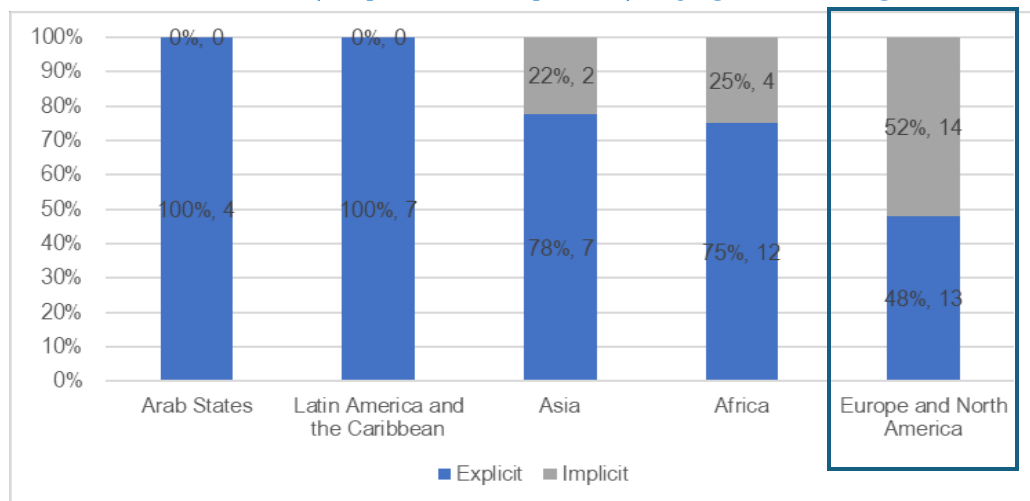

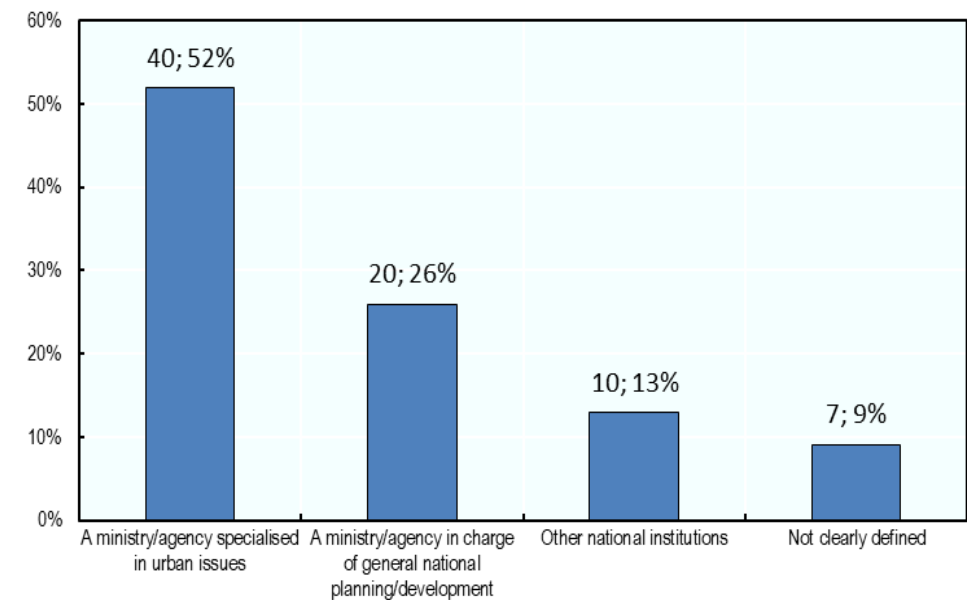
NUP form (explicit, implicit) by global region



Explicit NUP: formally identified by specific words in its title

Implicit NUP: a strategic policy (not explicitly labelled) with an urban focus or a significant impact on cities

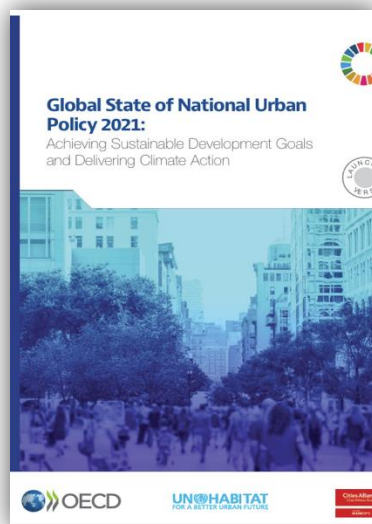
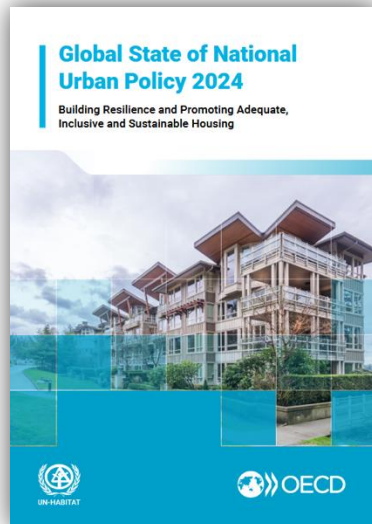
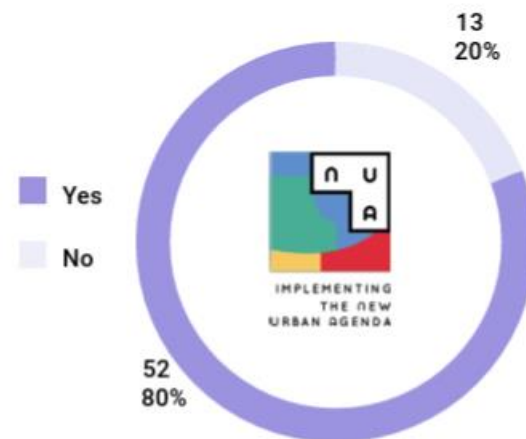


Figure 5.7. National urban policies that support implementation of New Urban Agenda

2023 NUP support for the New Urban Agenda



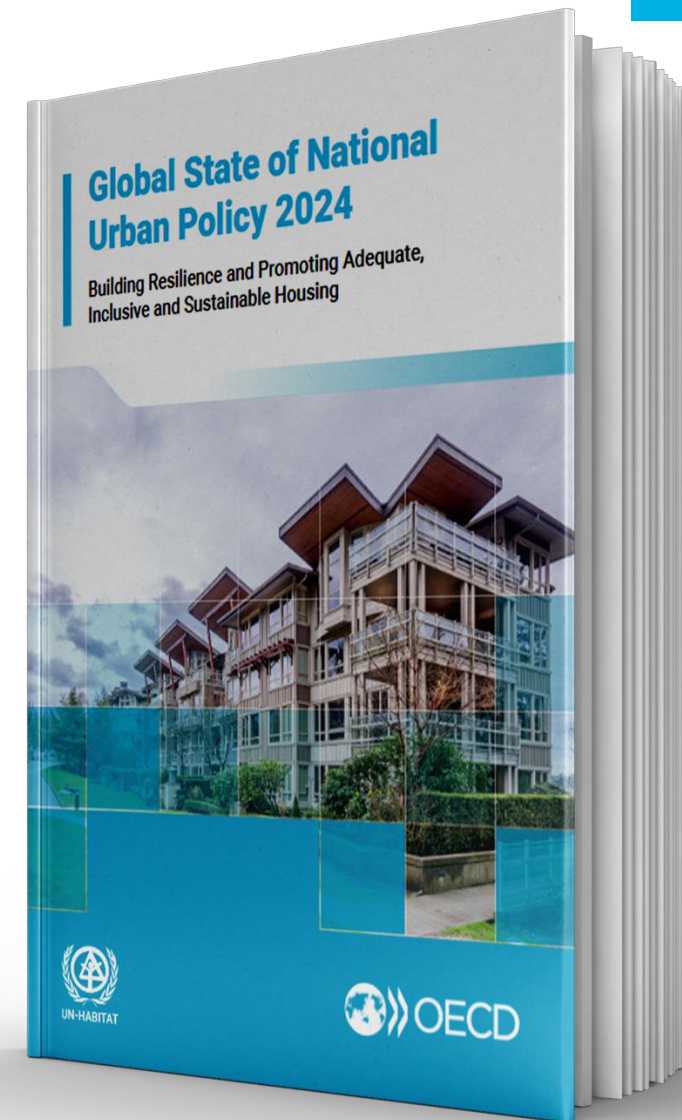

- Countries using **NUPs** for NUA implementation rose from **60% (2021)** to **80% (2023)**.
- Countries adopted **various strategies** to monitor NUA implementation.
- Most Frequent Approach- Formulation of medium and long-term disaggregated urban demographic projections and trends.**
- Projections consider **economic, social, and environmental forces**. Reported by **52 countries (80%)**.

NUPs in Practice: Key Survey Insights

Key Takeaways:

- **No One-Size-Fits-All:** Countries adopt diverse NUPs – some broad, some focused; some guiding, some action-oriented.
- **Working Together is Crucial:** Most NUPs prioritize coordination within and between levels of government.
- **Resilience is Rising:** Climate and economic shocks are a growing focus of urban policies.
- **Housing Remains a Top Priority:** Addressing affordability, quality, and energy efficiency is common.
- **Missed Connections:** Opportunities to better link cities and surrounding rural areas exist.
- **Funding Needs Strengthening:** Relying heavily on national funds; exploring more local and private options is key.
- **Tracking Progress is Improving:** More countries are monitoring their NUPs, but sharing results needs work.
